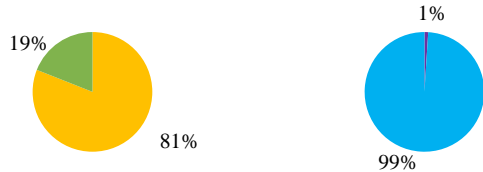

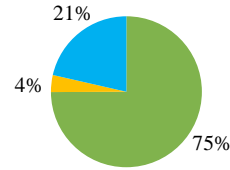

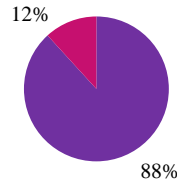

Expenditures



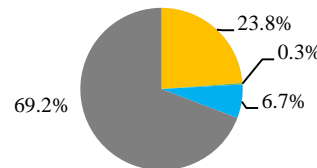
Personnel Equipment Non-Personnel
