



HOW TO understand classroom Delivery Methods

What does Delivery Method mean?

Delivery methods are the way the courses are offered. The main options for classes are either online or on-campus, which are pretty straightforward. However, because of the COVID-19 virus, HTC needed to implement a few variations so that the students could still receive the best instruction and learn in the best method to be offered.

What types of delivery methods are there and what do they mean?

On-campus

This delivery method is not displayed under the Delivery Method column for the schedule. If the Delivery Method is blank, the course is offered only on-campus (with no variation). However, instructors may still utilize D2L for online class homework but lecture/lab will be completed all on-campus.

Blended/Hybrid

This delivery method means that 25-75% instruction is offered online with regularly schedule in-person meetings. The class schedule will show day(s) and times for the in-person part of the course.

Mostly Online

This delivery method means that 75% of the course instruction is online with up to two in-person meetings. This option may also include up to four proctored exams (two of which could be offered in-person). This option may also include online synchronous instruction.

HyFlex

This delivery method means that the instructor is offering in-person instruction as well as remote synchronous and/or remote asynchronous options. There will be day(s) listed on the schedule as well as indicated times for the in-person class.

Completely Online, Asynchronous

[definition] ASYNCHRONOUS: *not existing or happening at the same time*

This delivery method means that the instruction of the course is completely online. There are no required in-person meetings on specific days or times. Students are able to complete coursework at any time during the week, while continuing to meet the indicated deadlines for assignments.

Completely Online, Synchronous

[definition] SYNCHRONOUS: *existing or occurring at the same time*

This delivery method means that the instruction of the course is completely online. There are specified dates and times for the online meetings (not in-person). Students are able to complete coursework at any time during the week, but must attend the indicated day/time for online meeting and/or activities.

Arranged

This delivery method is typically used for internships, specialized labs, and other customized courses and is guided by faculty. There is not a specified time for class. Student will work this information out with the faculty for the semester.
